DOs & DON'Ts - Quick Code of Conduct

V DO

- ✓ Pay your rent by 30th April each year (Rule 14).
- ✓ Cultivate your plot at least 75% must be crops/flowers (Rule 4).
- ✓ Keep trees to dwarf stock only, max 2m (6ft) (Rule 5).
- **✓** Lock the gates and report any security concerns (Rule 17.5).
- ✓ Compost green waste; only burn allowed materials after 6pm (Rule 8).
- **✓** Respect your neighbours no nuisance or harassment (Rule 16).
- ✓ Try to collect and store rainwater required for tunnels/greenhouses (Rule 8).
- **✓** Ask the Committee before putting up sheds, tunnels or fences (Rule 10).
- ✓ Use wildlife-friendly netting (butterfly netting, environmesh), secured with bricks/tiles or using a frame structure(Rule 10.7).
- ✓ Remove rubbish and dispose of non-recyclable waste responsibly (Rule 9).
- ✓ Supervise children, pets, and guests at all times (Rule 18).
- ✓ Keep dogs on a lead, take waste home (Rule 12).
- ✓ Report hazards, theft or vandalism promptly (Rule 17.7).
- **✓** Always consider your duty of care to others, wildlife and the environment.

X DON'T

- X Don't look for loopholes follow both the rules and their spirit.
- Don't assume that just because the rules don't specially mention something, it is OK; it may just be that it's never been asked before. If in doubt, ASK!
- **✗** Don't encroach on neighbours' plots or take items without consent.
- Don't park on haulage ways except briefly to load/unload (Rule 11.6).
- Don't burn plastics, carpets or smoky/toxic materials (Rule 8).
- Don't store fuels, accelerants, or valuables on site (Rule 17.2.1 & 17.6).
- ➤ Don't use poured concrete postcrete only (Rule 9).
- Don't plant trees beyond approved dwarf fruit trees (Rule 5).
- ➤ Don't use abusive or threatening behaviour (Rule 16).
- ➤ Don't use your allotment for business (Rule 7).
- ➤ Don't fly-tip or bring household waste to the site (Rule 9.2).
- Don't install glass greenhouses or glass panes in any structure (Rule 10.8).
- > Don't ignore Committee directions breaches trigger enforcement.
- ➤ Don't use herbicides, pesticides or any other chemical agent that is not approved for organic use, without written permission from the Committee

Site Rules at a Glance - Quick Guide

Allotment land is precious – please keep it safe, clean and fair for everyone. (Full rules and policies are available on the noticeboard, website, or from the Secretary.)

○ Waste & Materials – Not Allowed

- Asbestos hazardous & illegal
- X Carpets, rugs, underlay
- X Astroturf / fake grass / artificial turf
- X Tyres
- X Baths, toilets, sinks, plumbing fittings
- X Broken glass must be removed safely
- X Glass panes not for greenhouses, sheds or frames (use polycarbonate)
- X Poured concrete not for paths or posts (postcrete only)
- X uPVC doors/windows/panels
- X Large piles of rubble, hardcore or scrap

A Restricted Use

- Slabs OK for shed bases, paths and small seating areas
 - Plot must remain mainly cultivated
 - No large patios
 - Must not be fixed with poured concrete (postcrete only)
- Bricks limited for small jobs (e.g. edging or securing netting for crop protection).
 - Not to be used for building raised beds, walls or large permanent structures.
- Scrap metal only at committee-approved collection points

☑ Allowed

- Weed suppressant fabric (purpose-made)
- Heavy duty black plastic (temporary weed solarisation)
- Clean, ink-free cardboard (no tape, staples, glossy coatings)
- Safe timber, slabs or bricks tidy, limited to practical use only
- Netting butterfly netting, environmesh, insect mesh
 - May be draped and secured with bricks/tiles
 - O Must be tidy, anchored and safe for wildlife

Structures

- Sheds one per plot, max 8ft x 6ft
- Polytunnels/Greenhouses within size limits, polycarbonate only (no glass)
- Fencing max 1m high
- Structures must be safe, temporary, tidy, and approved by the Committee
- Unsafe or unsuitable structures may be removed
- Deposits will not be returned if plots are left with glass or banned materials

CCTV, Cameras & Drones

- Site CCTV covers communal areas, may record incidents (fires, theft, damage)
- Tenant cameras must only point at your own plot, no audio, keep footage private
- Drones need Committee permission, must have operator ID & CAA licence
 - o Follow the Drone Code
 - No flying over other plots or people
 - No filming people without consent

Key Reminders

- Remove all non-compostable waste (Rule 9)
- Unsafe/banned items must be cleared within 1 month if asked
- Plots must be left safe & clean deposits may be withheld if not
- Fires: after 6pm only, attended at all times, safe size & materials only
- Always lock the gate when you enter/leave
- Respect neighbours no harassment, nuisance or unsafe behaviour
